The Western Treatment Plant is the largest sewage treatment plant in Australia. It is 20km long, 10,851 hectares in area, has 22km² of lagoons, and treats 500 million litres of sewage per day.

Point Wilson Road / 29 Mile Road and Beach Road are accessible to the public at all times.

Farm Road, 160 South Road, 29 Mile Road, Jetty Road are accessible to the public when their gates (shown in red) are open 06:00 to 21:00 seven days a week. You may not leave the roads.

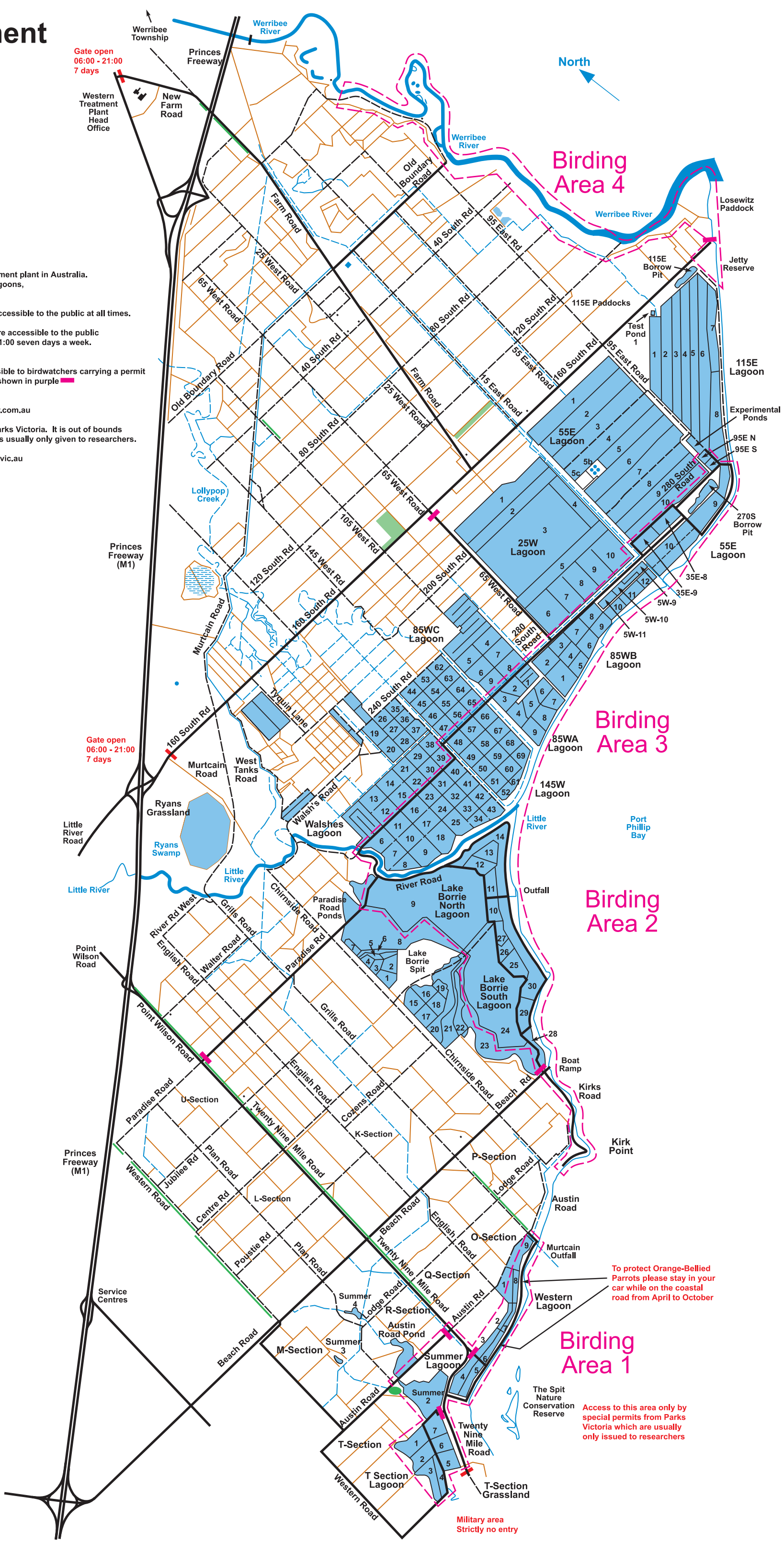
The areas outlined with purple dashes are accessible to birdwatchers carrying a permit issued by Melbourne Water and are accessed via gates shown in purple using the key that is issued with the permit.
